New aged care providers

Macedon Ranges residents aged 65 or over will soon have the choice of two providers when it comes to in-home support.

Benetas and Intereach have been awarded contracts by the Australian Government to transition into delivering aged care services currently provided by Council.

Council had decided to discontinue being the provider.

The Council said that the announcement gives the Council and clients more certainty to progress the transition of services over the coming months.

The Council is engaging a dedicated staff member to support clients through this period and be a key conduit of information between clients, Council, the community and providers.

"The two new providers have both already had a presence locally and Council will be there every step of the way to ensure a seamless transition for our clients, their families and staff. Council CEO Bernie O'Sullivan said.

Last year, Council resolved it was no longer best placed to deliver aged care services and would finish its role via the Commonwealth Home Support program at 30 June this year.. Whole Town Garage Sale

This year's Kyneton Whole Town Garage Sale will be on Sat Mar 18. register your garage sale through the Kyneton Community House website or by popping into their office at 34 Mollison St for a paper form by I2pm March 9.

Registration is \$5 and maps will be available on the day between 8am - 12pm for \$5 each.

Much cheaper V/Line fares

The cheaper V/Line fares promised by the ALP as part of its Victorian election campaign will commence from Mar 31.

Daily train travel costs anywhere in the state will be capped at \$9.20, bringing regional fares in line with Metro Melbourne daily rate fares.

This represents a massive saving for Kyneton commuters with daily peak time return fares currently costing \$36.80 falling to just \$9.20.

The peak time daily return fare from Bendigo to Melbourne will fall from the current \$68.80 to \$9.20 also.

In 2007 V/Line reported a surge in customers using the train services after the last fare cut of 20 per cent.

One would imagine a similar, if not larger surge after Mar 31.

Good thing an additional 50 parking places is about to become available at the Kyneton Station.



Station Car Park extension

The extension to the car park at Kyneton Station is nearing completion. The new cark park is being built to the west of the existing car park, on the north side of the rail tracks.

The works will deliver 50 new and upgraded car parking spaces at Kyneton Station.

The project will also deliver an additional accessible car parking space, 10 new bicycle hoops, lighting and CCTV for the safety of car park users, wayfinding signage, improved pedestrian access and landscaping.

Free RATS for all



Towards the end of January Minister for Health and Member for Macedon Mary-Anne Thomas announced that all Victorians are eligible to pick up two free packets of RATs through their local council to help with early detection and treatment of COVID-19.

The State Government program is now open to all Victorians with all eligibility requirements now removed. Individuals can collect up to two packets for themselves plus up to two packets for each household member per visit, while people with a disability or their carer can collect up to four packets of tests.

RATs are the primary tool for early detection of COVID-19 and to enable timely clinical care, including access to antivirals for those eligible.

In the Macedon Ranges free RATS can be collected from Council Administration Centres and Goldfields libraries, including those in Kyneton.

PCR testing Clinic closed

Between August 2021 and the closure of Central Highlands Rural Health's COVID Testing Clinics at the end of last year, staff at Kyneton Hospital conducted more than 85,000 PCR tests with up to eight staff working each day during the peak periods.

Over in Daylesford, the staff tested more than 11,000 people.

Combined CHRH distributed more than 12,000 Rapid Antigen Tests to the community.

Temporary Hall closure

Kyneton's Red Brick Hall is to be closed for refurbishment from the end of this month.

Refurbishment works will include a new accessibility car space and ramp, a new kitchen, internal fit-out works and the relocation of doors.

Council expects the hall to be closed for about six months.

Arrangements have been made to relocate all regular users such as U3A, Kyneton Art Group, the Handweavers& Spinners and the Kyneton Municipal Band to the Kyneton Mechanics Institute for the duration of the closure.

U3A are uplifting their activities on Feb 17 with all Red Brick Hall located courses and activities commencing in the Mechanics Institute from Feb 21.

"The spacious elegance of the KMI, its indoor toilets and working heating will be revelled in!" Kyneton U3A President Alan Moor said.

"The RBH renovations will deliver indoor toilets, functioning heating, a new kitchen and improved access. It will be a pleasure to move back in at the end of June!"

Pohlman St footpath works



The Council's 2018 Footpath Plan identified the need for a new concrete footpath on Pohlman St. Shane Walden, Director Assets and Operations said that all new footpaths must ensure safe pedestrian access for people of all ages and abilities; this includes reducing surface material changes, minimising incline variations and

reducing level variances.

"Council discussed these concerns with concerned residents to better understand their views and explain the footpath project rationale.

"Following discussions, Council and residents agreed to retain the bluestone crossovers where safe pedestrian access was possible" Mr Walden said.

Construction completion is anticipated by the end of March.

As councillors, we welcome community petitions as they give us a measure of authority and support in our discussions with Council and council officers over relevant issues. However, Council has strict rules regarding the format of petitions and their signatories and unfortunately, petitions that do not meet these requirements are excluded from being formally tabled with Council.

COVID booster jab

From Feb 20 everyone aged 18 and over will eligible for a booster jab provided that 6 months has passed since their last jab or SARS CoV2 infection following advice from the Australian Technical Advisory Group on Immunisation this month.

Since October last year the so-called Omicron soup wave has claimed the lives of over 2,000 Australians and over 800 Australians in aged care.

The long term health implications with roughly 5% of COVID sufferers going on to develop the chronic fatigue syndrome like condition long COVID and excess mortality from

complications of other conditions exacerbated by COVID are becoming apparent.

Medical experts are encouraging those eligible to seek their jab from GP clinics or pharmacies.

Over 10 million additional doses of bivalent Pfizer booster vaccine are coming online in coming weeks across the country.

The Pfizer bivalent vaccine combats against the original Wuhan strain as well as being specifically adapted to combat against the BA 4 and BA 5 subvariant strains of Omicron.

Potholes

Extremely wet weather and floods towards the end of last year caused damage to many roads in the shire.

In the interim, Shane Walden Director Assets and Operations advises that the Council has temporarily patched potholes, implemented speed reductions and installed safety signage.

The roads and underlying road base must dry sufficiently to conduct permanent repairs.

"With warmer weather, the teams are now in full flight. Repair works will likely continue throughout most of 2023, as we prioritise high-use roads and those with significant damage" Mr Walden said.

Accommodation support

Windarring offer a wide range of services to people with disability, in Kyneton, Gisborne, Castlemaine, Bendigo and surrounding areas.

One of the really important services they provide is accommodation for people with disability.

Their accommodation services are designed to support people with disability to live independently, with our short-term accommodation (respite) unit designed to give families and loved ones a break, and potentially readying a person with disability for independent supported living opportunities.

Windarring has four 2-bedroom independent living units in Kyneton. These units support fully independent living, with accessible bathrooms, laundries, kitchens, living areas and communal outdoor areas.

Windarring's professional staff can provide various supports to people with disability within these homes, including meal preparation and menu planning, personal and housekeeping support.

Those living in the units are also able to access activities delivered from the Windarring site, and regularly travel together to a variety of destinations on weekends to enjoy all Victoria has to offer.

Similarly, Windarring's respite unit supports independent living (accessible bathroom, laundry, kitchen and living area), however clients can be supported up to 24-hours a day, depending on their support requirements.

People with disability can utilise the respite unit for as little as a night, and as much as 2-weeks at a time. If you, a friend or a family member are interested in living in a Windarring unit or would like to access the Windarring respite unit, please call 54227001.

Dementia discussion



Driving after a dementia diagnosis will be the hot topic of discussion at Central Highlands Rural Health's Annual General Meeting on Thu Feb 16 at the Kyneton Ambulatory Care Centre from 7.30pm.

There is a high prevalence of people living with dementia across the Macedon Ranges and Hepburn Shires.

According to a 2022 Australian Institute of Health and Welfare report, 517 people were living with dementia in the Macedon Ranges Shire, of which 204 were males, and 314 were female. In Hepburn Shire, there are 389 people living with dementia, with 240 females and 149

males diagnosed.

Guest speaker at this public event is Professor E. (Joe) Ibrahim, a medical specialist and academic in aged care who has been a practising senior consultant specialist in geriatric medicine with over 30 years of clinical experience.

Several years ago, Prof Ibrahim produced an animated video addressing the complex issues involved in assessing whether a person with dementia is fit to drive. He believes screening this video at the annual general meeting will help generate discussion, and possibly debate, among the public and health professionals during a Q&A session.
